INVERLOCH FORESHORE REPORT

Meeting held with Mayor Neville Goodman, CEO Alan Bawden and BCSC officers on the 17th of July 2006

1. Cuttriss Street

[a] Toilet available in camping reserve ? Signage ?

Council will check with caravan park owner.

[b] When the earthworks are done in relation to the Broadbeach project, will the pathway be maintained along the inlet from the Angling Club to Screw Creek?

Yes.

[c] Rotary will plant small vegetation at the Cuttriss Street boardwalk [as discussed with Derek Hibbert].

Working bee.

2. Cuttriss Street to Pier Road

[a] Dual purpose pathway Cuttriss St. to Pier Road ??

Yes. A path of Tynong toppings has been budgeted for and plans started .

[b] Clear a path along the sea wall at Toy's Backwater.

Concept well received and will be investigated.

[c] Clear rubbish under trees Beilby to Pymble Sts.

To be investigated.

[d] Clear a path off the road at Pier Road.

This will be done as part of 2 a] above.

[e] Clear 2 large bushes on the nature strip at 28 Hopetoun St.

This will be done.

3. Venus St. to Abbott St. approx. 1 Km

- [a] The new path is now under construction.
- [b] This area is the only possible place for scenic views on the whole of the Inverloch foreshore apart from the jetty. If the Council adopted a policy, in this area, of creating a vista below trees and above low ground plants it would provide a valuable asset for the seaside resort of Inverloch. It can be done without risk to the foreshore.
- # Opposition from a " blinkered " council officer. However the Mayor will walk the new path with us on its completion to consider our suggestions.

4 Rotary Centenary Park

- [a] Naming status: Passed by the Registrar and now goes for Community comment. Signage?
 - # Name will be approved soon.
- [b] Rotary would like to work with Council to make this area a first class facility for the residents of Inverloch and visitors. possible 2nd BBQ and playground?
 - # Still on the plans for the future.
- [c] Clear views on seaside of the Park and clear bushes and two large dead cypress trees from the toilet area .Signage?
 - # Will happen.
- [d] Location of fitness station? The grassed area is now restricted by the new path and parking and the fitness station should be located on the east side of the toilets.
- [e] Provision for bus and caravan parking ?
 - # To be investigated.
