Bailey is a Golden Retriever/Labrador cross. These breeds are selected for a balance of intelligence, initiative, temperament and other factors, but still many dogs are rejected after months of expensive training.

Two organisations provide guide dogs to the blind, "Guide Dogs Victoria" and "Seeing Eye Dogs".

Puppy Raisers ensure the pups are toilet trained, able to walk on a lead and are introduced to the sights, sounds and smells they are likely to encounter as a working Guide Dog.

The pups' food is provided free, along with all veterinary care, and Puppy Raisers are fully supported by advisors who visit every six weeks during the 12-month period.

To take on the fulfilling role of Puppy Raiser, you need to:

- Live in metropolitan Melbourne or the Geelong or Ballarat areas and have your own transport;**
- Be prepared not to leave the pup for more than 3 hours;**
- Have a securely fenced yard;**
- Not have children under school age, and**
- Allow pups to sleep inside the home overnight.**

Pups can be boarded back at Kennels in fact it is encouraged that this occurs two to three times during the year. The pups love going back to the kennels.

Guide dogs are provided free of charge in Australia and this is funded by donations with only 5% coming from government contribution. Dogs not

required for Australians are sold overseas for \$50-60,000 to help support the organisation.

A: The Caesarean Section is a district in Rome.

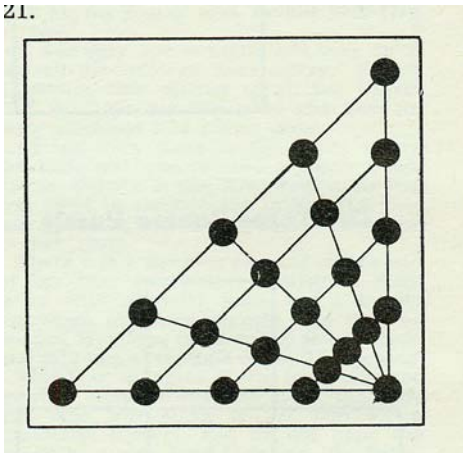
