Program: Club discussion of previous (December) board minutes and ongoing projects, major items were:

- * Withdrawal from roadside cleanup program after major changes to our contract with ‘Keep Australia Beautiful Council’ and Vicroads.**
- * Inverloch Jazz Festival will give recognition of Rotary Club of Inverloch as a sponsor of the Street Parade in their programmes and advertising.**
- * Meeting with Parks Victoria to agree on size, shape, content of our “Directional Display” at Eagles Nest. (Now approved all bar the fine details.)**
- * Rotary Centenary Park: Agreement from Bass Coast Council officers for current installations by Rotary of 3 tables, 2 seats,**

street light, a light in BBQ shelter, Rotary sign along the road edge and Rotary wheels attached to the BBQ.

- * Board approved a \$1000 donation to help Kerrie Beaugelhorn to provide books for patients with type 1 Diabetes at the Royal Children's Hospital.
- * President Ian and the board have presented a proposed master plan for the walkway and other pedestrian safety issues between "The Glade" and Cuttriss Street to the Mayor and Councillors of Bass Coast for their comments and hopefully incorporation into Council plans for this area.
- * President Ian having discussions with Museum of Victoria and BCSC about the possibility of setting up a "Dinosaur Display" in the Environment Centre.
- * A date has been set for our Dinner Auction on Friday the 16th of May, Judy will pass out list of donors to approach.
- * \$5000 of Jane Hackle trust fund has now been paid to BCSC for Exercise Stations along the foreshore walk.
- * Weekly dinner charge was reviewed and stays at \$20
- * Craft Market is lacking some numbers of stalls and variety inside the hall, so Ken will produce a promotional brochure to be distributed at other larger Melbourne and Regional markets to attract some new blood.
- * The Club has a first aid kit to be brought to any Rotary working bee, BBQ etc. But for major events like Music in the Glade, Jazz Parade and the like, we have agreed to request the Saint John's Ambulance trained staff to attend.
- * Treasurers Report showed the club in a good financial position after a successful summer Market season and a sell-out in the Boat Raffle.
