Thank you very much for your generous donation of a \$1,000 cheque to purchase books to give the children of the Royal Children's Hospital Diabetic Unit. Your Book Donation is gratefully appreciated. Please know that we are indebted to you for your outstanding contribution and support, for this cause. The Medical staff at the Hospital have spoken highly of this book program and we Thank You for your participation .

To further let you know what I do as the Royal Children's Hospital Inverloch Diabetic Unit Aux I have run a Fundraising Dinner Dance in July for the past 11 years. Part of the money raised from this event over the past 11 years has gone to set up a complication screening program at the R.C.H for diabetic children. 1,400 children once a year go through this program to have their eyes, heart, kidneys and vascular system checked for any early onset of complications that comes with Diabetes. There is no Government or Hospital funding for this program it is run only by the money raised from this Inverloch event. So as you can see this event has become very important to keep this program up and running. Since we have set up this program over 11 years, Complications have dropped from 30% to 2%. So we are slowly winning the war against some diabetic complications. Further funds from this night goes into Research.

Eight children are diagnosed with Insulin Dependant Diabetes every week at the R.C.H. They continue to need specialist attention every 12 weeks for the rest of their life.

Thank you for believing in our vision & helping us to be one step closer to a longer & easier life for Diabetic Children.
