RAWCS Team to tackle Kokoda Track

The national chairman of Rotary Australia World Community Services (RAWCS), PDG Lou Johnson plans to lead a team of

Rotarians along the Kokoda track, to both honour Australian soldiers and to raise funds for ongoing RAWCS activities.

The trek is planned for August 15 to 20, with places for the 96 kilometre journey open to two Rotarians from each District. Endorsed members of the party will be expected to conduct fundraising activities within their own Rotary District – by way of sponsorship for each kilometre walked. For an Australian-led tour of 30 people or more, the cost will be approximately \$2295, plus international airfares, personal porter if required and incidentals.
