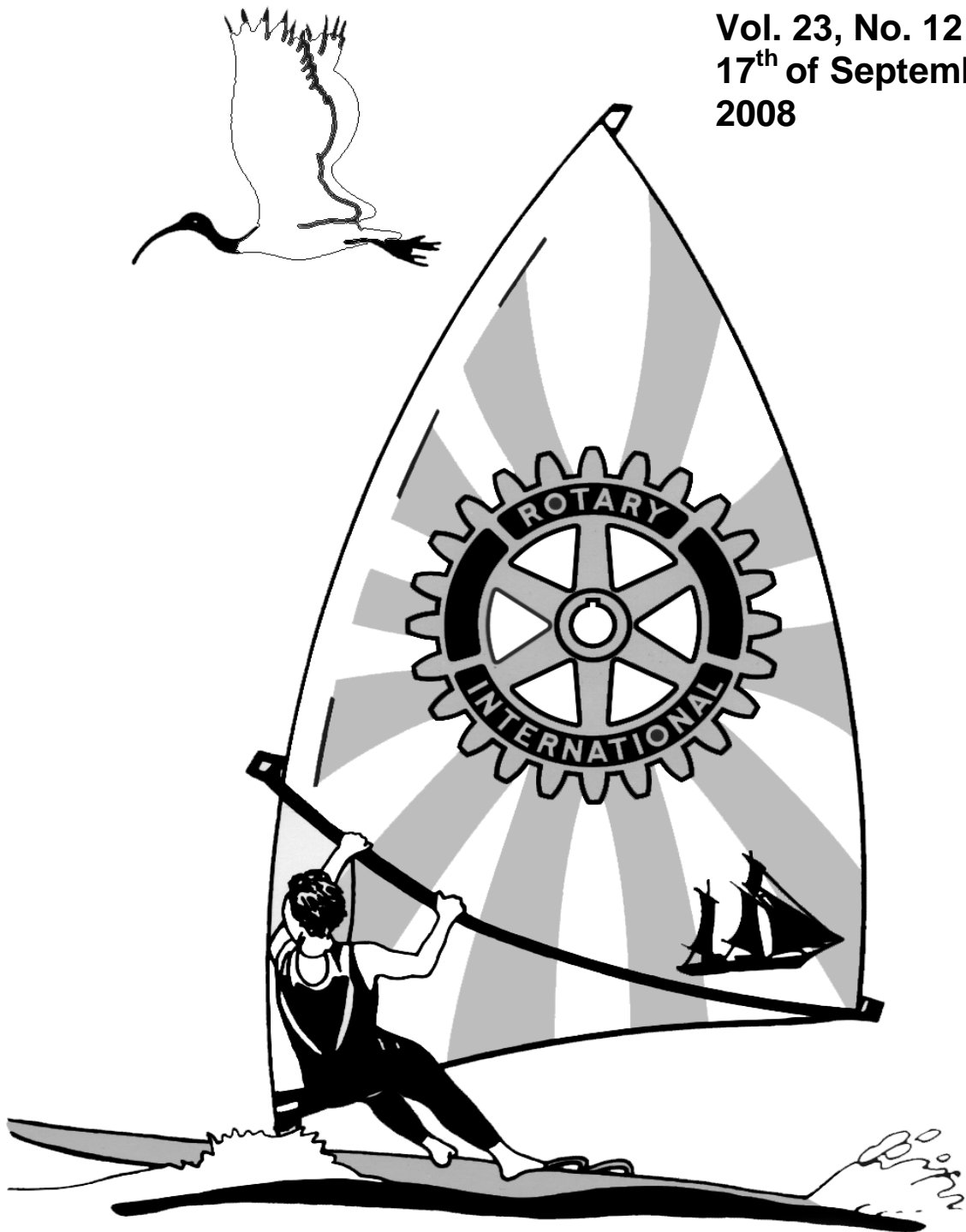

District Governor's message far from dry

District Governor Ken McDonald along his wife, Margaret, made his annual visit to the Inverloch Rotary Club last Wednesday night and delivered a message that was far from dry.

Ken talked about his recent trip to San Diego where he and 530 District Governor elects learned of the devastation throughout the world caused by insufficient water resources (or more importantly a lack of clean water).

“Every day of the year 30,000 children under the age of five die of preventable causes”, Ken quoted from statistics sourced from the World Health Organisation.

“That’s really an indictment on the world”, Ken said.

“When we look at the water that kids are drinking, out of puddles,” he said.

Ken spoke of how important it was to provide people with “good, clean water.”

“With the water they can produce their own food.”

“Give a man a fish and he will eat today . . . teach him how to fish and he will eat every day,” Ken said.

Ken echoed the sentiments that Rotary International President, Dong-Kurn Lee, imparted at the District Governor elects’ meeting highlighting the importance of water, health and hygiene, and literacy.

“It’s about education . . . not only in the undeveloped countries, but in our own country in the north where people are dying from mosquito bites.”

He said a \$6 injection could keep people safe from deadly diseases.

Basic education:

Ken said he was astonished by a recent episode while waiting in line at a bank.

“As I stood in the bank there was a male about 25 years of age and here was the teller filling out the form for him because he couldn’t read or write.”

Ken spoke of the importance of educating our younger generations.

Ken stressed that Rotary’s future would rely on the success of membership growth.

As an old football coach once screamed “**do something!**”

“We need to get our bums into gear . . . it only takes one to ask another,” he said.

Ken closed by reiterating that water would solve a lot of our current world problems, literacy was also very important, and Rotary membership was required to “**promote the whole thing.**”

“Get behind your board . . . and do it with fun and fellowship and you will succeed,” he said.

Volunteer Grants Program 2008 – Application guidelines

These guidelines are to assist organisations applying under the Volunteer Grants Program 2008

The Volunteer Grants Program 2008 **closes 5pm AEDT on Friday 17 October 2008.**

The Volunteer Grants Program

The Volunteer Grants Program 2008 recognises the valuable work of Australia's volunteers and is part of the Australian Government's ongoing commitment to supporting volunteers and encouraging volunteering in local communities. Funding of between \$1000 and \$5000 is available to eligible not-for-profit organisations to purchase small equipment and sporting items to help their existing volunteers and to encourage more people to become volunteers. Organisations will be able to request funding to contribute towards reimbursement to their volunteers for fuel costs incurred in their volunteering work. This will assist volunteers in their important work, including those who use their cars to transport others to activities, deliver food and assist people in need.

The Volunteer Grants Program 2008 provides funding of between \$1000 and \$5000 to help not for profit organisations to:

- buy tangible, small equipment items to help volunteers, and/or
- cover costs such as club sporting equipment and uniforms, training of volunteer sports coaches, and travel for specific sports-related purposes, and/or
- contribute towards fuel reimbursement for their volunteers.

There are two forms available to apply for funding under the Volunteer Grants Program 2008:

1. Single organisation application form for applicants applying on behalf of only one organisation
Organisations can submit one Single Organisation Application for grant funding of between \$1000 and \$5000. Organisations can apply for funding on their own behalf, or seek funding on behalf of an organisation that is not a legal entity.
2. Multi-organisation application form for parent organisations applying on behalf of themselves and multiple branches/outlets

Parent organisations can apply for funding on behalf of themselves and their branches/outlets, with the agreement of the branches/outlets. The parent organisation can submit one Multi-organisation application form for total funding of between \$10 000 and \$250 000, to purchase items, including a contribution for the reimbursement of fuel costs, of between \$1000 and \$5000 for each branch/outlet.

Call for applications

The Volunteer Grants Program 2008 funding round opens on **Friday 5 September 2008** and closes on **Friday 17th October 2008 at 5pm AEDT**. Only the 'online' or approved paper Volunteer Grants Program 2008 Application Forms will be considered.
