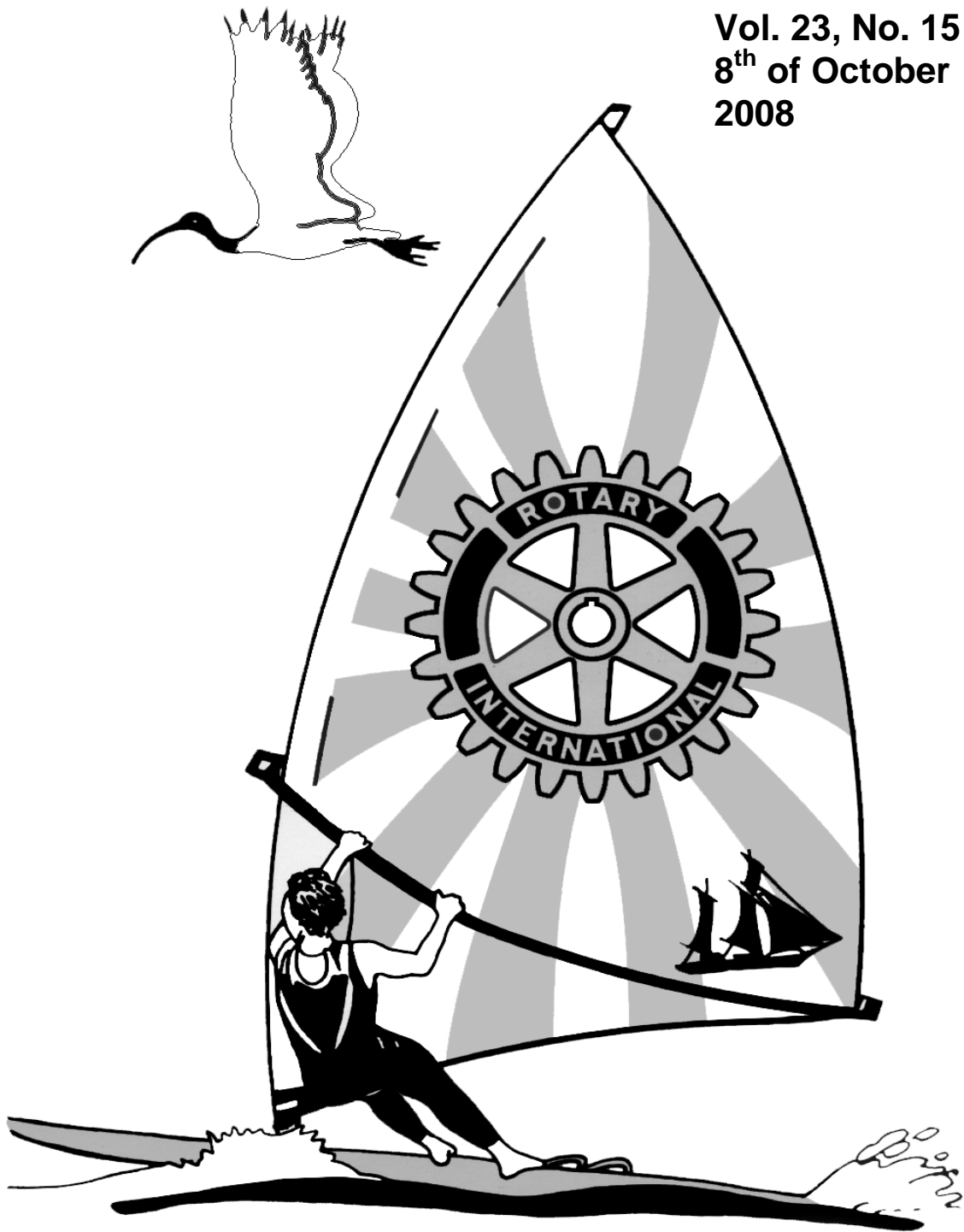

## **A Personal Reflection – A Rotary Challenge.**

### **Why am I a Rotarian ?**

I was reading a recent email from the Rotary Global History Fellowship (you can get these updates by going to [www.RotaryHistoryFellowship.org](http://www.RotaryHistoryFellowship.org)) and the article related to a Rotarian who from a distance helped a young disadvantaged African girl through her university and watched her grow into a successful TV reporter and business woman.

Shirley & I recently spent time in the UK and South Africa with 3 exchange students who were part of our family 14, 16 and 24 years ago. It was truly wonderful to meet their husbands and children and see just what successful young people they have become and to hear them talk so well of the influence Rotary has had on their lives. Rotary programs do work and we felt proud to have had that opportunity to sow into the lives of these young people.

While that little story relates to the successful YEP program, the programs of The Rotary Foundation are also just as rewarding and of course your involvement in the humanitarian programs of TRF can have an impact on the lives of millions of people.

Applications are now open with District for grants to match with a club in another part of the world to provide assistance for a disadvantaged community. If your Club has never applied for a grant why not ask the District for advice. Applications for District Simplified grants will also be open shortly. Watch for the mail from the District Grants Chairman.

You will read in another part of the DG’s newsletter of the application that has been made by this District (through the Mornington Club) for a Peace Scholar. Your Foundation at work.
