September is New Generations Month

The article below is Jared Lehmann's presentation to The Rotary Club of Mooloolaba. Jared attended the NYSF in Canberra this year. President Lindsay Rock described Jared as being enthusiastic and well-prepared in his talk to the Club.

JARED LEHMANN - NYSF

The National Youth Science Forum (NYSF) was an amazing experience. I went expecting some guidance about career paths, a few tours of universities and to be exposed to some interesting science. I left after two weeks with that

and much, much more. I made contacts throughout the scientific community, friends all over Australia and had experiences that will be remembered for life. My exposure to the National Youth Science Forum began early in life as my mother attended one of the first forums in 1985 when it was called the National Science Summer School.

After being selected by RC Mooloolaba, the district interviews were much more intense, and involved answering some questions about myself, current issues in science and a chosen field of interest, in my case physics.

In Canberra we were placed in groups according to our interests and possible career pathways.

My group all had an interest in engineering. Others included medicine, biology, physics or chemistry and the program for each group was tailored to their interests.

After an opening ceremony at Parliament House, we began our very busy program. I experienced numerous lab visits to places as varied as the Cotter Dam expansion, ANU's plasma physics lab, the Snowy Mountains Engineering Corporation, and the Australian Defence Force Academy. All of these visits were well coordinated and interesting, and often involved hands-on activities and tours of the amazing facilities on offer. Another highlight was a video conference with a scientist from CERN, the European Organisation for Nuclear Research.

At other times, various universities made presentations about their academic programs, we listened to guest speakers and we had debates about issues such as climate change and ethics in science. We also had to present a 5 minute speech on a topic of our choice. My speech was about "Why toast falls butter side down".

At the formal science dinner a friend and I were asked to provide musical entertainment on trumpet and guitar as guests arrived.

This event allowed students to make contacts among the scientific community, as well as to be inspired by the amazing guest speakers, such as the Australian Life Scientist of the Year Dr. Benjamin Kile, and the Chief Scientist of Australia Dr. Penny Sackett.

The middle Sunday was Home Hospitality Day. I was privileged to spend it with a couple from the Rotary Club of Fyshwick.

Rotary volunteers were invaluable during the science forum. They conducted mock job interviews for every student based on a resume and job application written before leaving for Canberra. I am sure this experience will be beneficial.

The experienced staff were able to answer many of my questions about university and life after school, and provided guidance towards university choices and careers. Their tireless enthusiasm and caring natures made them open to any enquiries or concerns I had, and thanks to these amazing people, I have a fair idea where I want to go in my next few years.

I would like to acknowledge everyone who made this incredible experience possible- the Rotary Club of Mooloolaba and the NYSF Committee of District 9600, my Rotary 'parents' in Canberra, my parents, the student staff or 'staffies', and most NYSF team who make it all happen. It was an honour to attend such a great program, and I would recommend it to anyone interested in science or engineering careers.
