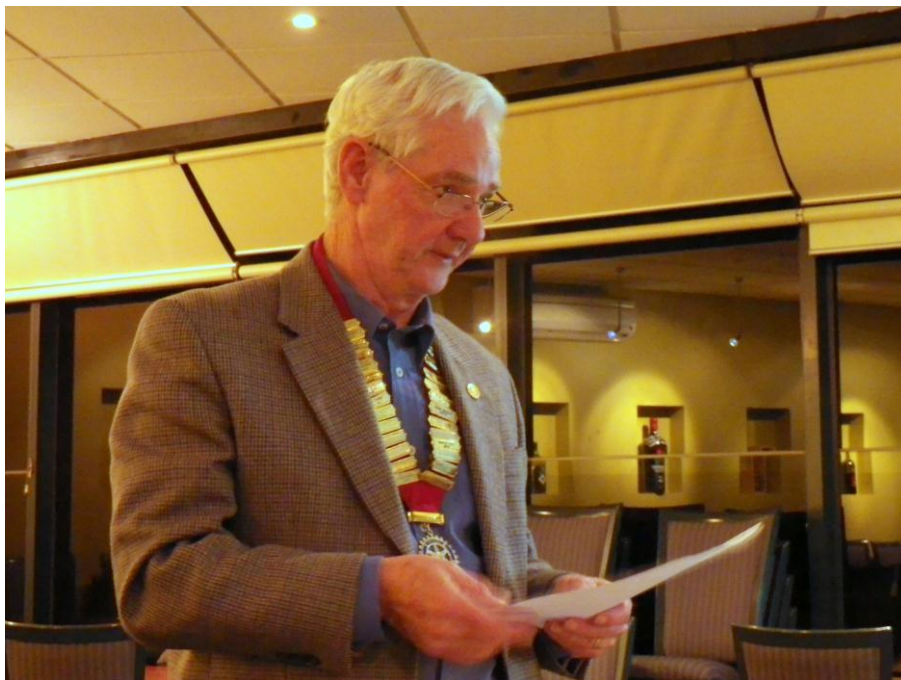

From the 2012-2013 DISTRICT GOVERNOR - DG Tony Spring

It is indeed a privilege and an honour to be the District Governor of District 9820. I thank the members of the Rotary Club of Frankston North for the nomination and for the District for selecting me to be your Governor for 2012-2013. I thank everyone for their support and encouragement and good wishes for the year.

I would like to mention PDG Kel Hobby and Jill. As I said at the District Changeover, Kel and Jill have worked tirelessly for the last twelve months in leading this District and what they have achieved has been amazing. The issues that have occurred from time to time have been handled with great wisdom and aplomb and he has left the District in a very good state. Kel and Jill have attended many, many functions throughout the year which have been appreciated by all.

The DG Partners Project in Timor Leste has been an outstanding success and with a total approaching \$50,000, Jill should be very proud of what has been achieved. The committee for the project will be chaired by PDG James Webb and it will oversee the distribution of the funds over the next few years.

I would sincerely like to thank PDG Kel and Jill for their outstanding year, In January this year we received the good news that India had been Polio free for 12 months and had been taken off the endemic country list. We were also informed that Rotary had met the Bill and Melinda Gates challenge of \$200 million and on top of that, Rotary was given a further \$50 million to assist in the eradication of Polio. Whilst we have met these challenges, Polio still exists in three countries and we need to continue the fight to ensure we complete the job. For this to happen, we must continue to give to Polio Plus as the amount needed is still many hundreds of millions of dollars. Please consider donating to Polio Plus in the coming year.

Last year our District was the only District in Australia to achieve a growth in Membership. PDG Dennis Heslin and his extension committee chartered the Rotary Club of Casey. This was a tremendous boost to our District numbers. It should also be noted that the District would have grown even without the chartering of Casey. Thanks to Keith Gregory and the Clubs who have grown during the year. We need to continue the push for new members to ensure that District 9820 does not become a casualty of redistricting.

During the year there will be a significant emphasis on The Rotary Foundation. As you are aware, The Foundation changes as of 1 July 2013 and Future Vision becomes a reality. Whilst there may be some minor changes to Future Vision between now and then, it is a certainty that it will go ahead. We have to be prepared, at both District and Club level for these changes. PDG Ray Martin will head up the District Foundation Committee for the next three years and it will be his responsibility, along with the Foundation Committee, to ensure we are all fully trained and that we are up and running as of 1 July 2013. Training teams are in place and you will all be informed in due course as to when the District and Club training will take place.

The theme of RI President Sakuji Tanaka for 2012-2013 is "Peace Through Service". During the year he will be running Peace Forums around the world at different times and he encourages each District to send representatives to these forums. Please give this some thought.

I am encouraging every Club to apply for a Presidential Citation. Please read about it in the new District Directory. The definition of Peace is very broad. It basically encompasses what we as Rotarians do in our every day Rotary life. For his definition of peace, please read the speech that RIPE Sakuji Tanaka made at the International Assembly in San Diego earlier this year.

Carla and I are really looking forward to meeting you all when we make our Club visits over the next few months and hearing of all the wonderful things you are doing.

55th District Conference in Geelong, February 21st - 24th 2013

You will recall from the recent District Conference in Ballarat, DG Tony announced that the 2013 District 9820 Conference will be held in Geelong.
