RAWCS so often has a hand in helping the world stand on its feet. It supports Rotary Clubs in sending teams of volunteers to developing countries to provide assistance upon the development of much needed facilities, especially within the health and education areas.

Advice, assistance and training in building, construction and commercial operations ( for example, assistance in obtaining microfinance) are also provided by RAWCS to support developing communities in establishing themselves.
