#### **Items from the Meeting.**

**President Ian welcomed the DG Charlie and wife Jan.** He then gave an outline of Inverloch's major projects of:

Screw Creek changed arrangements. DG suggested getting invoices for the materials to get this year's grant. Shade sail installation at the Wonthaggi Disabled School; Community Garden; Breathometers; Installation of the computer, sound and visual system into the Hub; Breakfast get together to raise Rotary awareness; Foundation; Ebola crisis and actions; 3MFM.

**President's Announcements/Items for discussion.**

1. The marquee came up well following washing last week.
2. Bass Coast Children's Book Expo: On Thursday at the Coal Mine was a roaring success. See the article and photo in this week's Sentinel Times  
The Book Expo is on Saturday 25th October, from 10am to 1 pm at the Coal Mine. Shirley, the Expo organiser, has asked if we can bring the stage and marquee for the day. I explained we might need some assistance on the day for erection and dismantling. They are meeting this evening and will contact me tomorrow.
3. Wine tasting and dinner Friday 10th. 44 people coming so far, this will make the night viable.
4. Wednesday 3rd December booked for our Xmas Breakup at the Captain's Lounge, Espy hotel.
5. Pizza Oven for the October – Cup week raffle, and a Hobie package for the December –January raffle was ratified by the Board. I've written to Bunnings asking for a discount on the price. Other Prizes RP indicated a voucher of 4 rounds of Golf and carts value, TG indicated he would give entry tickets to Stony Creek Races. Bundles of 20 tickets were taken by members.

7. Jazz Festival looking for additional partner to help organise. Ian and Terry to meet Jazz organisers.

**Treasurers Report** – Isabella indicated that for last year the spend was \$3567 with Donations \$2330. Income was \$1634. Opening Balance \$415,106 Closing \$14022

Jan Speirs outlined the Project 'Operation Cleft Lip, as the one she was supporting for the year. She decided on this project because her father in 1963 was the Secretary of the Australian Baptist Society. He was involved in Northern India and Bangladesh and through this to the family. Thus when Charlie became DG, Jan said 'she wanted a project that reflected my father's activities'. My Dad was also a Rotarian.

Operation Cleft Lip was a project started by the Rotary Club Of Box Hill Central. The project uses local people, with surgeons educated in UK, Canada, USA and Australia. There are approx. 300,000 people with Cleft palates in Bangladesh. Population 150 million in the size of Victoria and almost all low lying river delta country. The % of children with cleft palate is the same as in Australia but in Aust an operation is completed in early infancy. Each \$250 gives a child a new start. Can go to school, given speech therapy and can go outdoors. "A smile for life"

DG Charlie gave an excellent talk covering the big picture of Rotary international and what it means for us to be members. This year's phrase is 'Light up Rotary' and its focus is to make a difference. Charlie outlined various projects, eg. Polio Plus, where it has been just one member with an idea and drive to make that difference and see the project as an international supported project. Charlie mentioned all the good work we do needs to be publicised to ensure Rotary is not misunderstood.
