Exciting news for ROMAC and for District 9820!

From the District 9820 website: Due to an extremely generous donation by the Jared Dunscombe Fund, we currently have a young boy from a small, remote village in Timor-Leste at Monash Medical Centre, who had life-saving surgery on Monday afternoon.

On Saturday 6th September, Kathy and John Dunscombe (members of the Rotary Club of Cranbourne) and their daughter Jonelle, DG Charlie and Janne and Geoff and I were at the airport to welcome 'Aze' and his father Ezequiel to Melbourne. We were all greeted by two extremely nervous, very tired and extremely excited visitors and the beaming smile on young Aze's face said it all. Anna, from the East Timor Consulate, was on hand as an interpreter, so that everyone could easily communicate with each other.

After a number of tests on Monday morning, where Aze shed a few tears when he had his first needle, he underwent the surgery he had travelled so far for. Aze's procedure, even though quite routine here in Australia, is not something that is available in his own country. It is called a Patent Ductus Arteriosus (PDA) closure. PDA is a congenital disorder in the heart where a blood vessel fails to close off naturally after birth. If uncorrected, the PDA would more than likely lead to heart failure. As well as this condition causing Aze to have an extremely enlarged heart, which has stopped him from do things a boy his age should be doing, the condition has also severely stunted Aze's growth. Even though he is almost 8 years of age, Aze is only the size of a 3 year old.

A small setback late on Wednesday night resulted in Aze spending time in the ICU, but once his heart was back in correct rhythm, he was returned to the ward and was soon back on the road to recovery. Aze is now out of hospital and recuperate at the home of Kathy and John, and once given the 'all clear' he will return home to the rest of his family in Timor-Leste.

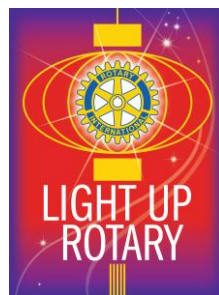
